Dan Poynter always says, "The worst place to sell a book is at a bookstore." A few years ago,

having just done a book with a major celebrity, I decided to follow his advice. I jumped at the opportunity to "volunteer" my author to do the entertainment and to sell his book for their fundraising effort.

The setting was a residential back yard. The stage was the corner gazebo, and his audience was a collection of wealthy donors, most of whom had contributed to the cause in the past. Unbeknown to me, most of them already knew how and what to contribute for the evening. The book was a good idea. I didn't know the facts.

My plan was to have him sign his new book after dinner for charity. They had set up a card table in a dark corner of the garden with a stack of books I had brought. I discovered too late, the normal procedure at these "gala" events is to pass among the patrons and collect the checks after the celebrity's performance, then everyone gets up and leaves. Only two people even glanced at the dark corner of the yard where the table and our celebrity guest stood ready to sell books. He sold and signed two books, then dutifully contributed the less than \$30 to charity.

As for bookstore signings, when I was writing *Book Blitz* I asked authors for personal disasters and heard some very sad and funny incidents. There was the bookstore owner who paid an author for a cross-country trip, the hotel, meals, etc., but forgot to tell his staff—no signs, no ads of the event in the local paper, no direct mail, no crowds, nothing...just all that expense, time and embarrassment.






